Planning Your 2024 Garden

Garden Site Selection


- Vegetables should receive 6-8 hours of full sun and greens should receive at least 4 hours.
- Pick a spot close to home, work, or community centers
- Check access to water supply (Rain barrels, hose, or watering can)

- Be prepared to water your plants often. If they start to die, water them less. There's a middle ground.
- Use the grid below to sketch out your garden. Decide how much space you have to garden in and draw it on the grid below. Then mark down existing landmarks, like trees, before deciding where your plants will go.
- Keep the grid and drawing sizes proportional to your actual garden. Plant spacing recommendations can be found at: www.edibleflint.org/gardenkits
- Remember to include paths that allow you to access plants
- Advanced gardeners: Consider interplanting and how neighboring plants impact each other in terms of pests, disease, shading, and crop production.

- For gardens approximately 500 square feet

Greens Kit Partial shade is ok for greens \$10 each

- 5 seed varieties

COMPOST BASICS



WHAT IS COMPOST?

Compost is a dark, crumbly, porous, soil-like material. In nature, compost or humus is created as plant materials break down over time. It is rich in organic material but it is not the same as soil. Earthworms enrich soil by mixing organic materials with minerals in the soil. Compost is not the same as mulch. Mulch is used to suppress weeds and maintain moisture in garden beds. Mulch will break down over time and add to organic material in the garden.

COMPOST WORKS AS A FERTILIZER

Compost adds nutrients from organic material to gardens. Rake compost into the soil around the base of your trees. Nutrients from the compost will feed the roots of the tree.





APPLY COMPOST TO GARDEN BEDS

Sprinkle compost on to soil of garden and gently turn over the soil to mix in the compost. Compost adds organic material to the soil. You can use an online compost calculator to figure out how much compost you will need. Measure your garden and find out how much compost is needed to add an inch of compost.

ADD COMPOST TO CONTAINERS

Mix compost with soil and perlite in a container. Perlite is a material that keeps soil from compacting in a container and compost adds nitrogen and other nutrients that plants use to grow and produce fruit. Compost should be about 20-25% of a container.

The Edible Flint Garden Starters Work Group started preparations for you and your garden in late fall of 2023— reviewing the surveys you returned — and what you wanted more of or perhaps did not want at all. Discussions followed on how to serve all growers...and now this work group offers 4 distinct kits: *Kitchen Garden*: 18 transplants responding to your wishes for 2 or more of each transplant and your 8 different vegetable choices. This kit includes 4 varieties of seeds. The *Greens Kit* has 3 of your most-sought transplants (4 of each!) and 5 varieties of quick growing seeds The *Pepper Pack* has 2 transplants of each of 5 varieties of pepper including the much-requested Lunch Box Peppers. Mary Sam's Gardens in Burton is growing the transplants of herbs including both Thai and Sweet Basil, Oregano, Thyme, and Sage: 2 transplants of each with a good start in a 4" pot. The herb kit includes 6 sets of seeds including nasturtiums — edible flowers with a peppery bite that many requested. Expect a follow-up question on the 2024 survey! AND a Pollinator Kit is offered for the first time with cosmos, coreopsis and bee balm transplants as well as 5 varieties of seeds.

197 individuals purchased garden kits and compost in 2023: 413 Kitchen Garden Kits, 142 Greens Kits, 97 herb Packs (sold out very early), 120 pepper packs (sold out early) and 459 bags of compost! The Work Group believes you will be gardening in 2024 so substantial orders have been placed with 3 local growers - bulk orders for 19 varieties of seeds!

And 450 bags of compost reserved! Flint's Garden Starters' Work Group and Flint area growers look forward to supporting your garden. Order forms are enclosed or on line at www.edibleflint.org/gardenkits. Due by May 3, 2024.
